Tomahawk from cattle guard to Thompson Trail. Blade, Crush and Water. Removed large rocks from road sides.

Tomahawk from Thompson Trail to Yellow Knife. Blade, Crush and Water.

McDonald Ridge. Blade, Crush and Water.

Tomahawk from West Yellow Knife to East Yellow Knife. Blade, Crush and Water. Blade and Smooth Road bed at Limpia Creek Crossing East Yellow Knife to Tejas. Blade and Hauled 2 loads of mix. Water to set.

Tejas in good condition at this time.

Apache Trail from Bandolero to Six Shooter. Blade, Crush and Water.

Replaced leaking air line to tail gate release cylinder

Tear down front axle on John Deere to replace pivot bushings and Universal Bearings
